

I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to all those who contributed to this edition, and to everyone who continues to make SURYA a place of opportunity, growth, and success.




BUDDING SCIENTISTS COMPETITION – A SHOWCASE OF CREATIVITY AND CURIOSITY




MATH MARATHON WEEK CELEBRATION


